Of course, David kept their attention with his working clockwork cars and trolley bus while the class were astonished when Kris told them she had to walk 3 miles to school because there was no bus.

So, what was the standout thing that showed the difference between school children from when we were all five years old to now? For me it was when we were talking about reading and books. Kris was telling the children that we did not have television, we read books and listened to the wireless. I asked, "Who likes reading?" Very few hands went up. Carrie-Anne suggested i-pods, so I asked, "Who had i-pods?" Ninety per cent of the class responded with arms raised. This was plainly a good example of our different schooling.
